
We are now offering an email COLOR version of the Benson Bulletin.

Due to student numbers, kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd grades will run as single grades for 2024 - 2025. Our 4th - 6th grades will be departmentalized again with Mrs. Miller and Mrs. Schuyler. Mrs. Schuyler will teach 4th, 5th, and 6th grade math/Social Studies, while Mrs. Miller will teach ELA and Science to 4th, 5th, and 6th at each grade. Both educators have done a masterful job of providing our older students with direct, grade-level instruction.

BENSON READING GROUP

The reading group will meet at the library on Wednesday, July 17, 2024 at 4:00 p.m. to discuss *The Marsh Queen* by Virginia Hartman. Loni Mae Murrow's life as a bird artist at the Smithsonian in Washington, DC, is tidy, until she's abruptly summoned back home to the wetlands of northern Florida, where she grew up. Her mother, critical and difficult, has grown frail and been resentfully consigned to assisted living, and her younger brother, Phil, needs her help. Going through her mother's things when she returns, Loni finds a cryptic note from a woman whose name she doesn't recognize: "There are some things I have to tell you about Boyd's death," it reads. Boyd is her father, who drowned in a boating accident out on the marsh when Loni was twelve and Phil just a baby. She finds herself drawn into a dangerous quest to discover the truth about how he died. At last moved to avenge the wrongs done to her family, Loni has to decide whether to join the violence or end it.

The reading group will meet at the library on Wednesday, August 21, 2024 at 4:00 p.m. to discuss *The Magnificent Lives of Marjorie Post* by Alison Pataki. Marjorie's journey began gluing cereal boxes in her father's barn as a young girl. No one could have predicted that C. W. Post's Cereal Company would grow into the General Foods empire and reshape the American way of life, with Marjorie as its heiress and leading lady. Before turning thirty she amassed millions, becoming the wealthiest woman in the United States. But it was her life-force, advocacy, passion, and adventurous spirit that led to her stunning legacy. And yet Marjorie's story, though full of beauty and grandeur, set in the palatial homes she built such as Mar-a-Lago, was equally marked by challenge and tumult. She was a wife four times over.

Slate Valley Cares and Rutland County Free Clinic Partnership: Integrating Health and Nutrition

In May, Slate Valley Cares forged a new and promising partnership with the Rutland County Free Clinic (RCFC). This collaboration represents a significant step forward in our mission to provide comprehensive support to our community, addressing both food security and health needs.

Starting this month, RCFC will be hosting free health screenings at Slate Valley Cares. These screenings will be available to all members, providing vital health checks such as blood pressure, glucose levels, and blood oxygen levels. 

In the very near future, we will have to address some very important decisions. Such as, what to do with the existing gas pumps, and whether or not to attempt housing on the second floor.
